

#### **Senior Food Drive**

Partnered with the City of Santa Fe Senior Center to provide bags of food for seniors.  With community support and in collaboration of the Mary Esther Senior Center we filled and distributed food bags to over 200 seniors.

#### Senior Blessing Baskets

Providing essential items to senior citizens alleviating financial burden.

- 163 baskets & 163 free meal tickets (10 meals per ticket) to Mary Esther Senior Center
- 25 baskets to home health seniors
- 89 baskets to Rio Rancho Senior Center

## The year in review

This year we began with humble intentions. We definately envisioned growth for each of our establised initiatives but were overwhelmed by the response of our community and supporters by which we surpassed our initial intentions beyond measure.

During the pandemic we were forced to put a hold on our annual prom. A special event organized specifically for individuals with disabilities. Due to high demand we came back in 2024 and held a magical event which hosted over 300 of Northern New Mexico's most special guests.

Although the prom had been on a hiatus we continued to partner with the Mary Esther Senior Center providing care baskets to senior citizens. We provided a local high school with food, drinks, supplies and clothing to fill their pantry. We also provided the medically fragile classroom with items to support their students. These initiatives grew immensely in 2024 with close to 400 baskets distributed and over 220 meals provided to Santa Fe families.

2024 also became the inaugural year of our Darlene McKnight Christmas Toy Drive with which we were able to provide over 2000 gifts to the youth of Santa Fe county and thanks to generous donors we were able to branch out into Rio Rancho.

As an organization our goal is to become a resource to individuals in our community in need of assistance. This year we assisted over 25 families with immediate assistance with food, clothing and essential home items. We hosted two GoFundMe campaigns to assist a young woman and a young man with medical expenses. We even reached our four legged friends by enlisting our supporters to donate supplies for a local pet rescue organization.

2024 also allowed us the opportunity to participate with other organizations by providing a pizza dinner for the local youth shelter, partnering with the American Red Cross to participate in the annual Wreaths Across America event as well as our blanket drive for veterans.
